

**Poverty Guidelines for  
Older Americans Act and  
Older Californians Act Programs  
Last Updated: February 2008**

The purpose of this page is to provide a convenient place for Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) and their service providers to find information on poverty guidelines. This information is updated periodically from the Federal Register by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), under the authority of 42 U.S.C. 9002(2) (<http://aspe.hhs.gov/poverty/08poverty.shtml>). The Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment (SSI/SSP) rate, used for the Brown Bag Program, is effective upon issuance of Social Security Administration (SSA) Publication Number 05-1112 dated January 2008 (<http://www.ssa.gov/pubs/11125.html>). It is the AAA's responsibility to implement program eligibility criteria updates in accordance with the information provided.

## **POVERTY GUIDELINES**

Tables A,B,C,D and E, along with the following summaries of individual program eligibility criteria, provide the most current poverty guidelines available. This site has been designed as a one-stop poverty guidelines resource site and eliminates the need for multiple searches.

The ***Older Americans Act Title III Programs*** use the FPG for targeting and reporting purposes. These programs do not have income eligibility requirements for participation. The AAAs shall consider the needs of individuals at or below 100 percent of the FPG in targeting services. Services shall be targeted to those with the greatest social and economic need with particular attention to low-income minority individuals (California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 1.8, Chapter 3, Article 3, Section 7310). See Tables A and B.

The ***Senior Community Service Employment Program (Title V)*** shall use 125 percent of the FPG for eligibility criteria and reporting purposes. For additional information, refer to the United States Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration Advisory System, Training and Employment Guidance Letter No. 14-06, February 9, 2007. See Tables A and B.

***Linkages*** shall use 100 percent of the FPG for reporting purposes. Linkages Programs report the number of clients at or below 100 percent of the FPG as the number of poverty clients. Poverty status is no longer based on client income alone. If the client does not live alone, the family income must be used to determine poverty status reporting. See Table B for family sizes larger than two.

***Alzheimer's Day Care Resource Centers (ADCRC)*** shall use 100 percent of the FPG for reporting purposes. ADCRCs report the number of clients at or below the FPG as the number of poverty clients. See Tables A and B.

The ***Senior Companion Program*** shall use 125 percent of the FPG for eligibility criteria and reporting, except in areas designated by the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) as designated high cost areas. In these areas, eligibility levels specified below are based on 135 percent of the federal poverty guidelines<sup>1</sup>. See Tables A and C.

The ***Brown Bag Program*** shall use 100 percent of the SSI/SSP for blind individuals or couples living independently for eligibility and reporting purposes. Program eligibility is based on age (persons 60 years of age or older) and income. Participant incomes can be no higher than the payment amounts established by the SSA in California [California Welfare and Institutions Code, Division 8.5, Chapter 7.5, Section 9543(b)]. If it is determined that a surplus of foodstuffs exists, the program may also provide these services to persons 60 years of age or older with incomes not exceeding 125 percent of the maximum SSI/SSP for the blind (Section 9543(c))<sup>2</sup>. See Tables A, B, and C.

The ***Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy Program (HICAP)*** uses the FPL for reporting purposes. HICAP's are required to report incomes as either greater than or less than 150% of the FPL. See Tables A, B, and E.

The ***Respite Program*** does not use poverty information for eligibility, reporting, or targeting.
